Planning Priority #1 – Social Emotional Learning

Students will feel like valued members of the school community.

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Teachers and students will participate in weekly LIFE GROUP sessions
- Teachers will collaborate about effective strategies for building positive relationships with students
- Student-voice groups will be developed to define “belonging”

Planning Priority #2 – 21st Century Competencies

Students will develop an understanding of and apply 21st Century competencies (6C's) across subject and discipline areas for learning, work, and life.

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Teachers and students will co-construct meaning and develop a common language to reference the C's and deep learning
- Project Based Learning will be implemented at the grade 11 and 12 level offering an interdisciplinary approach to learning in a few select courses
- Teaching and learning will continue to shift to an inquiry approach with an emphasis on asking questions, visible thinking strategies, and solving real world challenges and problems

Planning Priority #3 – Assessment of Learning

Students will be able to articulate their learning and self-assess their level of achievement with the support of a teacher.

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Students will collaborate with teachers, peers, and experts for the purpose of setting goals and extending their learning
- Students will learn to use a 5-point rubric to monitor and reflect on their progress

Planning Priority #4 – Communication

NHS will establish effective communication strategies to engage and inform the entire school community.

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Increased social media presence; more content/postings
- Increased messaging around key programs such as PBL
- Distribute a monthly Principal's Message to all parents and students
